

East High student seeks seat on Erie school board

Jeff Woodard, a 17-year-old junior at East High School, has announced he will seek a seat on the Erie school board in the 1987 elections. He has filed for a Democratic Party nomination in the May 19 primary.

Woodard, 1121 German, has attended Erie schools since kindergarten and said his election would create a unique situation in which a student would have a voice on the nine-member board.

Woodard, who said he is the first student in Erie schools to try for a school board seat, outlined major problems he believes the school district faces. "These are attendance, tardiness, teen-age pregnancy, drugs and student dropouts," he said.

Woodard said he advocates "a better-established code of student rights and responsibilities that would not only be written by the (school) board, but also by the students, parents, teachers and administrators as a group."

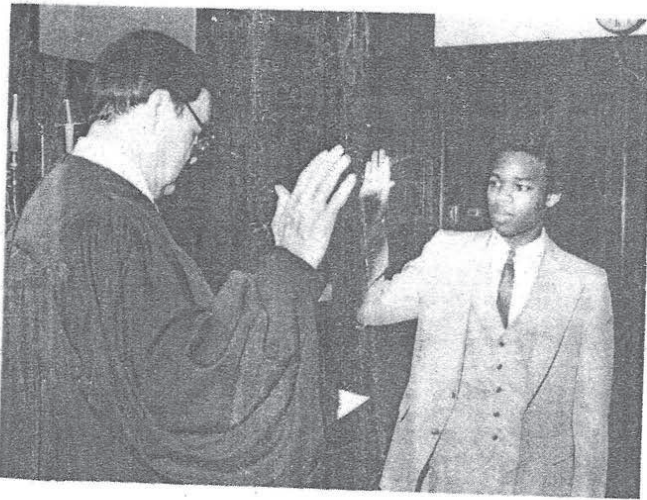
Woodard said that being a student in the system "would give me the chance to communicate with students, teachers and administrators. I would have an inside view of what actually goes on in schools and can see the changes and improvements which are needed."

Describing himself as "an average student," Woodard has been president of the Model United Nations and a member of the cross-country team. He is a member of the Community Missionary Baptist Church,

a former choir member there and past president of the young usher board.

He is the founder and past executive director of the Erie County Youth Election Committee, established to educate young people about politics. He also is a registered CPR technician, a member of Youth for Christ and founder and president of the Erie County Youth Government, an organization to help prepare young people for adult responsibilities and community service. He headed the "Students for Casey" effort in the 1986 gubernatorial race.

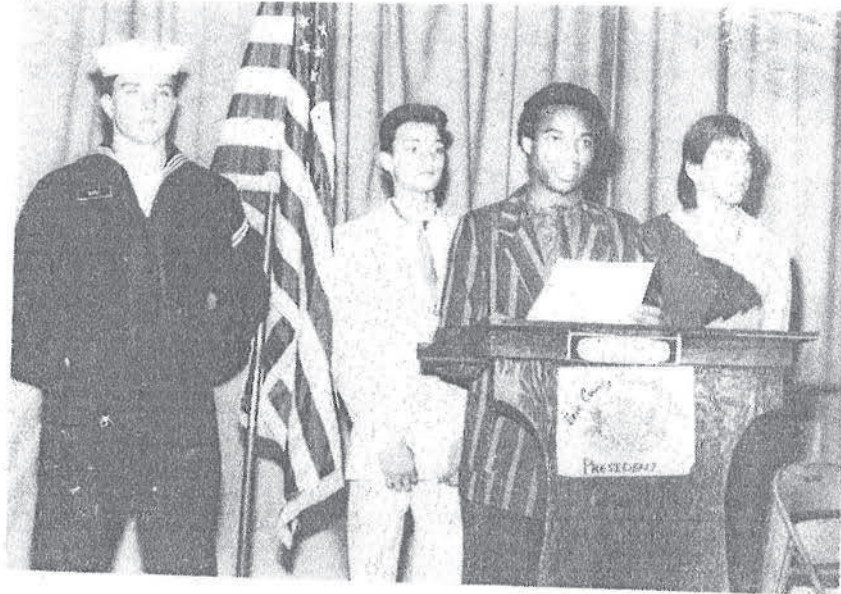

9- Woodard said that he had received a letter from Mary Ann Kulesa, president of the Erie County Young Democrats, which stated: "It

is my pleasure to inform you that you are one of the nominees for the ... award." The letter included a complimentary ticket for Woodard to attend the dinner and awards presentation.

But on Monday, Kulesa hand-delivered a letter to Woodard's home, which told him that "the executive board has decided that candidates for public office in the municipal primary are not eligible in this year's Young Democrats of Erie County First Annual Recognition Dinner."

Woodard said that wasn't one of the stipulations when the awards ceremony was announced.

Kulesa could not be reached for comment Tuesday night.

Youth Government Announces Goals

Members of the Student Senate and Congress of the Erie County Youth Government were inaugurated at ceremonies Jan. 29, at the Hilton Hotel.

The Youth Government is composed of high school students from Erie and Millcreek schools whose main purpose, according to its constitution, is to "get more students involved in our government through a citizenship preparation program of service, education and recreation."

Fred O. Rush, special assistant to Mayor Louis Tullio of Erie, administered the oath of office to the incoming legislators.

Jeffery Woodard of East High, the president of the Executive Branch

of the Youth Government, told the new legislators, in an address that followed the inauguration, "You must have in mind at all times that you are a leader and every teacher, parent and student is observing you and your decisions. You are the example and must be the best."

"Let us take pride," he said, "in what we plan, in what we dream, and, most of all, in what we do."

The Youth Government has undertaken an ambitious series of projects. Woodard said the Youth Congress' House of Representatives will try to get money to improve the Erie County Library System; work to keep the LIFT transportation pro-

gram going; seek answers to questions about the rights of young people to access to the waters of Presque Isle Bay, once bayfront development begins; work to improve parks in Erie; try to get a dance hall for young people and promote dances as a social activity; improve business to promote jobs; help provide activities for senior citizens; and try to get funds so the EMTA can restore Sunday service, at least on major routes to the Millcreek Mall, Lawrence Park and Buffalo Road.

Much of the Youth Senate's agenda is similar to that of the House, but Woodard said the Senate is looking to establish Breakfast Clubs in schools for Saturday morning deten-

^{As they said,} tion, instead of daily detention; work for the solution of street problems, from insufficient lighting, potholes and stop signs; ways to get housing for Erie; less; and send letters to large companies out west, inviting office those firms to come to Erie and at the vacant buildings available stores, shops and plants.

Other major officials of the Government, besides Woodard, Jack Sandusky, chief justice; Henry, vice president; Joe Valahovic, speaker of the Charles Faulkerson, chair of the adult cabinet; and Starke adult advisor.

EUP freshman Jeff Woodard seeks Erie school board seat

Remember the name Jeff Woodard. He could be President of the United States 20 years from now. He is ambitious, knowledgeable and charismatic enough not to settle for anything less.

But for now the 19-year-old freshman at Edinboro University is concentrating his efforts on the May Primary, where he is running for a seat on the Erie school board. Woodard will cross-file and seek both the Democratic and Republican nominations.

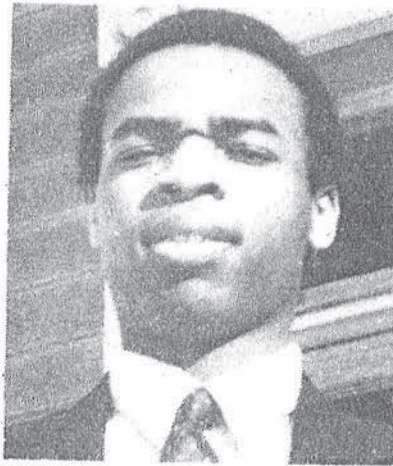
This is not the young Democrat's first crack at running for the school board -- he ran in 1987 when he was 17.

Woodard said he is seeking the office because he "believes in Erie, the students and the future."

The major problems he sees inside the school system are student attendance, tardiness and dropouts.

"I definitely believe there is a problem with tardiness," he said. "A student will lose credit when he's late to class. And everytime a student comes late his grade is lowered. So naturally the student is going to fail. That's another reason why I demand that students come to school on time and be prepared for class." Attendance problems, he said, relates to most of the problems that the student will have throughout the entire time in class.

Woodard is also not supportive of the efforts and preparation for the "Magnet schools". He said the program is supposed to be an open enrollment for students considered to be at risk of academic failure. He sees it as "singaling out

students with high academic achievement instead of students who really need help in areas of low test scores (because they) are not catching on very well with the other students."

The student dropout ratio is a major concern to Woodard. "They do not want to attend school anymore -- that comes from them getting in trouble once before." He said when they do return to school after they receive suspension, teachers remind them that if they act up they will be automatically suspended again. "They say that on the very first day the student returns. Which is not a positive attitude. If the teacher gave the student a positive attitude, a confident attitude, more students would get a better education and stay in school instead of dropping out."

Does the school board in general need more young people?

"Every few years there is time for a change. Some of the people who

have been serving on the board have been there for years and years. The people in Erie seem like they constantly vote for the same person because they remember that name all of the time."

Woodard said he strongly supports the efforts to improve the quality of education. "That's where the teachers play a vital role. I will support in-house continuing education for our teachers who need to know what methods work and how to put them into use."

The candidate said he would work on mandatory summer school for students who fail classes.

Woodard is majoring at Edinboro University in English writing with a minor in criminal justice. After he graduates from EUP he plans on attending law school at Gannon University.

At EUP, Woodard is chairman of the Student Activities Dorm Council and a member of the Student Government Association, Minority Students United and Democrats of Erie.

He is also a member of the Youth NAACP, St. James A.M.E. Church, Youth for Christ of Erie. He is the founder and board member of the Erie County Youth Government Association.

The college freshman has his path in life already carved -- politics-wise. After a stint on the school board he wants to serve on Erie City Council and from there up to the mayor's position. "And keep on traveling as far as I can get. There's no goal too high to reach."

EUP student is candidate for Erie School Board

While most college students are sitting in chilly classrooms stumped by ego states, algebraic formulas and impending term papers, EUP freshman Jeff Woodard is just plain *stumping*. For votes, that is.

Woodard, who grew up on Erie's German Street and attended East High School, is seeking election to the Erie School Board for the *second* time.

Not bad for a 19-year old college freshman who aspires to be president, not of a fraternity or student government, of the United States.

During high school, Woodard formed Erie County Youth Election Committee, an organization designed to educate students about politics. He served as Executive Director of the organization until last year.

Woodard also founded Erie

County Youth Government Association, which prepares youths for adult responsibilities and community services. He headed the "Youth for Casey" gubernatorial and "Youth for Jackson" presidential campaign efforts in Erie, and is a member

of Youth NAACP.

Now, Woodard, an English-Writing major and Criminal Justice minor at Edinboro, wants to begin his political career in the Erie school system.

"I will work on areas dealing with students attendance, tardiness, and dropouts," Woodard says. "I believe these are some major problems facing our school system."

Woodard also supports in-house continuing education for teachers and mandatory summer school for students who fail

courses. He sought election to the board while a 17-year old junior at East, but was defeated. Now he's back and determined to gain nomination in the May 16 primary.

"I'm running on both tickets this time," says Woodard, a cross-filing Democrat. "I'm looking to pick up as many votes from both Republicans and Democrats as I can."

Woodard runs his campaign from his dorm room in Edinboro's Centennial Hall. His dormmates have helped him organize

the election effort.

"Everybody's been very supportive," he says. "I'm really looking forward to the next few months of the campaign."

And in the six months he's been at Edinboro, Woodard's become involved in Student Government Association, Minority Students United and Democrats of Edinboro, as well as serving as Chairman of Student Activities for Reeder and Centennial Hall.

"I believe in Erie, our students, and our future," he says.

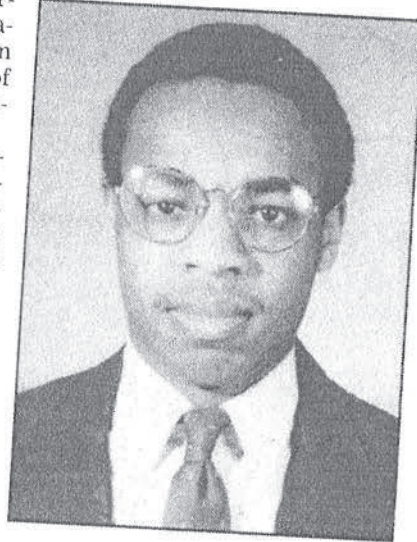
"If elected, I will continue to make the office more efficient and advanced in record keeping with modernization and updated computer operations for the public records," he said.

Woodard still in race for register of wills

Despite finishing last in the Allegheny County Democratic Party endorsement race for register of wills, 4th Ward Democratic Committeeman Jeff Woodard vows to stay in the race.

"I'm going to remain in the race because when you tell someone you'll do something and you take their money and support, you better follow through," he said. "If you quit, no one will take you seriously the next time."

Woodard, who ran for lieutenant governor last year, received 105 votes at the March 2 endorsement meeting, finishing well behind acting Register of Wills Bonnie Brimmer, who came in second with 758 votes. Eileen Wagner won with 845 votes.

"When voters go in the booth, they will be the ultimate decision-makers," he said. "You have to go with the people."

Woodard, the son of a Baptist preacher and the 20th of 21 children, said his education, business administration and human relations experience make him the best candidate for the county row office.

The register of wills presides at evidentiary hearings, adjudicates contested wills, issues marriage licenses, collects estate and inheritance tax-

es and serves as the clerk of Orphans' Court.

"I was a hearing officer with the city Human Relations Commission so I've done that part of it, and have a master's degree in business administration," he said. "Besides, issuing marriage licenses is the biggest part of the job, and as the son of a Baptist preacher—I've seen a lot of marriage certificates."

Woodard's education also includes an associate degree from Westmoreland County Community College and a bachelor's degree from Carlow College.

He also completed police training at the Pennsylvania Municipal Police Academy at Mercyhurst College in Erie, and has certificates in investigation and prosecution of hate crimes and crime prevention for law enforcement and business from the U.S. Department of Justice.

Until recently, the 33-year-old taught criminal justice at Robert Morris University and the Community College of Allegheny County, but he now focuses on his non-profit educational assistance firm, the Pennsylvania College Access Program.

The firm concentrates on private clients but also has contracts with the Wilkesburg and Duquesne School Districts to assist individuals with paperwork for admissions, financial aid

and scholarships for college and business schools.

Since he has yet to receive any party or association endorsements, Woodard is planning what he calls a county-wide "people's campaign."

He has scheduled a fundraiser April 3 at 5:30 p.m. in the canteen at the Hill House Association, 1855 Centre Ave., Hill District.

"I've spent my own money to this point and I plan on raising all my own money from here on out," he said. "I am planning fund-raisers, but will gladly take any direct contributions."
